# **Rock Lodge Trust** Survey/Field Trip Announcement

A Maryland Entomological Society summer survey/field trip will be held on Saturday, 7 July 2012, at Rock Lodge Trust, near McHenry, Garrett County, Maryland. The survey/field trip is scheduled to begin at 9:30 a.m. and last until around 5:00 p.m.

# Location: Rock Lodge Trust, Garrett County, Maryland

Rock Lodge Trust is a privately-owned natural area near McHenry in Garrett County, Maryland. The property is not open to the general public. It is located along Rock Lodge Road, just northeast of Deep Creek Lake. The land area is vast, encompassing 3060 acres, bordered by The Nature Conservancy's Glades Preserve on the north, Deep Creek Lake State Park to the south, and Savage River State Forest to the northeast. Meadow Mountain transects the southeast sector and the Cherry Creek acid bog drainage transects the northwest sector. A 5-mile logging road circles through the property, covering regions of peat bog, dense mesic Allegheny forest, and reclaimed grassland field and open water impoundment areas.

For the purpose of this "EntoBlitz," collecting of insects for identification will be permitted. All other observed fauna (and/or flora) should be recorded as well. Participants will need to submit a list of the identified species to survey coordinator Dick Smith who will summarize and prepare the survey report for the Rock Lodge Trust board. Species lists need to be sent to Richard.Smith@jhuapl.edu. This is a unique opportunity for all Maryland entomologists. The property has rarely been visited by any nature organization.

Meeting Location and Time: Intersection of Rock Lodge Road and Limousin Ridge Road (see maps on Page 5) at 9:30 a.m.

**Directions:** Take I-68 to Exit 19, MD-495 (Bittinger Road) in Grantsville. Take MD-495 south for 8.7 miles and turn right onto Rock Lodge Road. Take Rock Lodge Road southwest for 5.8 miles and turn right into Limousin Ridge Road. (Limousin Ridge Road is 1.6 miles south of Mosser Road.) The Rock Lodge Trust caretaker will arrange for some alternate places to park, depending on the number of cars, but this location will be good for a meeting point.

#### EARLY DATE FOR ROYAL WALNUT MOTH

On 27 May 2012, MES member **Ed Cohen** collected an adult male Royal Walnut Moth, *Citheronia regalis* (Fabricius) (Saturniidae) at a Citgo station off Swain Road in Allegany County, Maryland. This is an early record for this moth and may well be the earliest that it has ever been collected in Maryland. Many naturalists are familiar with the Royal's large (12 cm [4.7 in.]), distinctive caterpillar, the Hickory Horned Devil.

#### \*\*\*NOW AVAILABLE\*\*\* PETERSON FIELD GUIDE TO MOTHS OF NORTHEASTERN NORTH AMERICA

The new *Peterson Field Guide to Moths of Northeastern North America* by David Beadle and Seabrooke Leckie is now available. The guide covers the area roughly from New Brunswick south to Virginia and west to Minnesota and Missouri. Nearly 1500 species, illustrated by close to 2000 photographs, are included. About 950 macromoths species and 550 of the smaller micromoths are treated in the guide. Most macromoth species include range maps. Flight periods are represented visually for quick reference, and the plates utilize the Peterson identification system of arrows to highlight key features for confirming the identification of a species. The book retails for \$29.00.

#### INVENTORY AND MONITORING SYMPOSIUM 2012 MEETING OF THE LEPIDOPTERISTS' SOCIETY 23-29 JULY 2012

We would like the Symposium to have six, possibly more, 20minute presentations focused on your surveys and their results with the remaining Symposium time for discussion. Each project represents a baseline for the future and we want to hear about it. At present, we have long term studies from Colorado and are looking for more from Britain, Europe, South America, Asia, U.S. and farther afield.

#### Example below:

Long-term monitoring is of value to public lands. This citizen science inventory and monitoring project has over fifteen years of butterfly data for Rocky Mountain National Park. The species list grew from 94 to 140 confirmed species. Volunteers created a database with 78,765 butterfly sightings from 3,796 transect surveys. They also created a database with over 20 years of daily weather data from the National Weather Service Station, Estes Park 1SSE. Analysis is underway. If we had stopped after eight years, trends in the butterfly communities would have led to the hypothesis that chemical deposition, elk, drought, or all three have affected the communities' long term health. With fifteen years of data, the natural cycles of butterflies in the high elevation environment begin to be revealed. Even with relatively long-term monitoring, there is indeed danger of jumping to conclusions.




Figure 2: Rock Lodge Trust Map
